

MSK 3-D Printer

Students at the Middle School of the Kennebunks this year will have the opportunity to design and build products using a new 3-D printer purchased with funds from the MSK parent group and the EFKA. Students will follow-up the creation process by calculating the cost of their products, how they could make them cheaper or better, and how to market and brand the products. Students at Kennebunk High School have been working with a 3-D printer for the past couple of years and have created such items as quadcopters, sea perch robots, and a prosthetic arm.

Leadership School at Camp Kieve

For the fifth straight year, Middle School of the Kennebunks 7th graders attended the Leadership School at Camp Kieve in October. A daylong session at MSK, was followed by three days at Camp Kieve. Students worked on team building, healthy decision-making, communications, and other selfdevelopment practices through outdoor games including ropes courses. To reinforce the lessons learned at Kieve, an Educator in Residence (EiR) spent 10 weeks during the winter months working with all staff and students at MSK. The EiR goals included supporting the mission of the leadership school: positive risk-taking, the ability to set meaningful goals, making healthy decisions, being a team member while developing strong leadership skills. Again this year, the feedback from students and staff was extremely positive.
